Examining The Relationships Between Risk Disclosure, Sustainability, And Healthcare Firm Performance During Crisis

Abstract

This study investigates the relationship between a firm's performance during a crisis and its supply chain management practices before the crisis. Specifically, it examines two critical dimensions of supply chain management: internally, the extent to which firms understand risks within their supply chains, and externally, their efforts to promote sustainability across the supply chain. Using empirical data from healthcare sector firms during the COVID-19 pandemic, the analysis identifies statistically significant links between pre-crisis supply chain management practices and firms' efficiency, liquidity, and leverage during the crisis.
